




# No child should need to go to bed hungry



Shockingly, 20.0% of households with kids report facing this challenge, while 45.4% of those on Universal Credit feel the pinch even more. These statistics from the latest Food Foundation food insecurity tracker show the widespread issue of food insecurity in our communities. Despite these challenges, we continue to hope that we are able to make a difference. St Mark's Meals exists to help make sure that no child goes hungry, providing vital support to families in need. Together, we're not just addressing hunger; we're building a stronger, more caring community where everyone has enough to eat.



### Our survey said....





We asked our partner schools and children's centres to tell us about their experiences working with hungry children and St Mark's Meals. Here's a summary of their responses.

- Teachers and support staff gave Meals boxes to children as support during difficult times. Such as families experiencing bereavement, domestic violence, sudden loss of support or financial hardship.
- They were given to provide practical assistance during transitions (such as changes in accommodation or financial support.)
- School staff tell us that the boxes provided both practical and emotional support for families.

  Reducing stress and providing precious moments for families to cook and eat together.
- Parents consistently expressed gratitude for the support provided from their communuty.

St Mark's Meals boxes served as a lifeline for families facing various hardships, offering not just nourishment but also stability, comfort, and a sense of care and support during difficult circumstances.













We now cover 118 schools and children's centres in MK






### GIVING IT AWAY



Our Network of Meals Hubs






### Finances

This year's deficit of £5611 is largely due to the increase in demand. Our income has almost kept pace with our outgoings. We need to continue to meet this increasing need and so will be looking at ways to increase our income and reduce our costs over the next year. We also hope to find alternative ways to purchase some of our food items to keep the cost low without sacrificing quality.
